## BACKGROUND

The APRM in collaboration with the GIZ and the Institute for Global Dialogue (IGD), based at the University of South Africa (UNISA) are developing a Virtual Training Programme. The training will focus on South-South Cooperation (SSC) to the implementation of Agenda 2063 and SDGs on the Continent.

As part of the revitalization process of the APRM, the 28th AU Assembly of Heads of State and Government extended the mandate of the mechanism to include the monitoring of the implementation of the African Union Agenda 2063 and United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). To fulfil this mandate, the APRM has over the last three years engaged in promoting South-South Cooperation in Africa in order to support the achievement of Agenda 2063 and Agenda 2030. This has included numerous efforts such as the convening of dialogues and side events highlighting the importance of SSC as an important mode of cooperation among countries in the global South.

Several key issues have been identified from these interventions, such as the need to develop an inclusive approach that allows stakeholders to collaborate effectively for results and impact. This also includes the importance of aligning SSC projects with national development needs.

The collaborative training course on SSC will cover the background, current developments and the significance of the cooperation in achieving both the AU Agenda 2063 and UN SDGs. The training is part of larger APRM efforts to increase awareness as well as engage with pan-African organizations and UN specialized agencies to enhance coherence between the global and continental development agendas for Africa.



## **Training Programme**

The training will take place over four (4) weeks and will cover the background/origin, as well as the significance of South-South cooperation in achieving Agenda 2063 and SDGs. The training provides presentations, recorded lectures, interactive discussion with a guest speaker and short quizzes to maximize the benefits of the course. Participants are highly encouraged to get engaged in the platform and make the best use of materials.

## **Eligibility**

This programme targets postgraduate African students, experts working in the African Union, civil servants, youth and Civil Society Organizations. Female candidates are strongly encouraged to apply.

## **Guest Speakers**

Students will have the opportunity to engage with various experts who will be invited to share expert knowledge on South-South and Triangular Cooperation.
